- Child and Youth Connections: Results From CFSR Round 3 (2015–2018). This report
 uses Round 3 (2015–2018) Child and Family Services Reviews (CFSR) results to
 understand how, how often, and how well child welfare systems helped to promote and
 preserve children's connections in four areas: with parents; with siblings; with extended
 family; and with children's community, culture, school, and friends. In each area, data
 from Round 3 of the CFSRs provides information about state child welfare systems. The

- CFSR Aggregate Report Addendum, Round 3: FYs 2015–2018. This addendum supplements the Child and Family Services Reviews Aggregate Report for Round 3 (FYs 2015–2018). Readers should refer to the full report for a comprehensive explanation of the Round 3 results. The purpose of this addendum is to use advanced statistical techniques to better understand the associations between items, outcomes, and case characteristics. Children's Bureau Access to CQI Sites Post-Program Improvement Plan (PIP) Monitoring

The Children's Bureau (CB) respects each state's right to conduct continuous quality improvement (CQI) reviews without further CB oversight of its case review work unless assistance is requested. As states complete their non-overlapping periods, CB access to the state's Online Monitoring System (OMS) review site ends, unless the state has requested ongoing assistance from CB to support the accurate application of the Onsite Review Instrument and Instructions (OSRI) in case reviews. CB encourages states to continue to use OMS for ongoing case reviews and take advantage of the reports and data that can be pulled from the system to assist in monitoring case practice and outcomes for children and families.
